Project Summary

Project Title:	Building a sustainable life & health of women and children of Tsunami Disaster victims.
Targeted area for work:	Special focus on (Tamilnadu), South India is: In and around of Chennai City, Cadalur District, Nagapattinam District, Thirunelveli District, and Kanniyakumari.

Introduction

The Republic of India (India), the world's sixth largest energy consumer, plans major energy infrastructure investments to keep up with increasing demand--particularly for electric power. India also is the world's third-largest producer of coal, and relies on coal for more than half of its total energy needs.

Once more I want to use this opportunity to grief with the people of South Asia and have been devastated by one of the largest disasters in the history of the region. With a death toll that could reach 250, 000, more than 1 million children in the disaster area, leaving many without homes or parents. But even given the daunting physical and psychological challenges facing them, these children are the fortunate ones. According to UNICEF, children comprised one-third (if not more) of the disaster's 150,000 some victim's families throughout the affected area are trying to put their lives back together.

Objectives

The people of India and especially the Street children and women, who where badly affected by the recent Tsunami disaster...not to mention the previously available problem in Health Care/educational standard/poverty and other social and economic issues due to lack of adequate financial capacities. This has resulted to making the nation unsustainable, how long will innocent children suffer in silence? Their future lies in what will do today.

Our mission in the country is basic to support the existing organization resources that providing tens Kitchen units, these units will continue to give life-saving food and pure water to the children after the initial emergency response of the relief aids to victims to the people of Tamilnadu, South.

Educational programs for children and women- this will basically involve helping to eradicate illiteracy in the long term and building up their God given potentials, helping them to face the challenges of the recent disaster. Addressing the children's physical and psychological needs, plus setting up a vocational school and social activities for some semblance of normalcy. And educating them on diseases, especially HIV/AIDS and general health care, especially in women which hold a vital role in the family and thus the family makes up the society.

Key areas of focus and impact of Disaster

The Tsunami affected areas in Tamilnadu, South India is:

1. In and around of Chennai City
2. Cadalur District which is about 180 kms from Chennai.
3. Nagapattinam District which is about 350 kms from Chennai.
4. Thirunelveli District which is about 650 kms from Chennai.
5. Kanniyakumari District which is about 750 kms from Chennai

We can cover this entire place by road enroute to Kanniyakumari and back totaling about 2000 kms.

In all these District nearly 40 to 50 Thousand people lost their life, most of them are fishermen lived near the seashore. Many children and ladies are stranded without any support from their near and dear and also without knowing what to do for their future. Most of them lost their business, job properties like boats, nets and houses and they are in aimless stage

The relief aids and educational programmed to help the victims in the Tsunami affected areas, it is important to note that in Tamilnadu the operations will be more effective or certain to that the relief measures reaches the effected persons directly.

Mode of operation:

In our project involves diverts technical skills relating to health, children development and sustainable development.

Process Evaluation of result:

The following methods will be followed in evaluating the net result of our activities at the end of every quater:

- 1- Questionnaire form will be distributed quarterly among the targeted members and to non-member residing nearby our targeted member for the fair opinion at random sampling basis.
- 2- Arrangement of group discussion among the members with the staffs and some of the member of our Board of Directors/international volunteers regarding result or benefit-asking suggestion for further modification and improvement of our services
- 3- And utilizing other possible system or ways available for evaluation
- 4- And adopting yearly auditing system by qualified auditor for the expenditures in connection with the Operational activities , investment and fund due to fund raising activities and submit report to the concerned authority including the donor group as and when required.
- 5- From the Entry register of the victims reports for Medicare facilities and their frequency etc.

Operational Staffs and Personal:

All the operational workers & personals are kind of locally available and with collaboration with international volunteers and organizations. It is important to note the partnership with the Carmelind Foundation (India) in these activities.

Fund Raising Activities :

The following steps will be taken for raising the fund from international and local sources. To allow the local wealthy people to avail facilities by donating funds, accommodation facilities, food and other basic needs.

- A- To organize conferences and social events.
- B- By international volunteers from out targeted members to involves themselves in fund raising activities for the society and useful contacts.
- C- From donors agencies. And organizations
- D- Membership fees

Volunteers cost

General cost will be U.S. \$.10 to 20 per day per head. This depends on the place and type of accommodation you choose to stay. But we are pleased to get support from an India Citizen who will provide accommodation from 5 volunteers.

Is our intention that every child is both physically and mentally sound, where street children are no where to be found, and where children are no longer robbed of childhood by the economic need to work! And women been empowered with the basic skills /knowledge and able impact their community positively which will lead to sustainable development.
